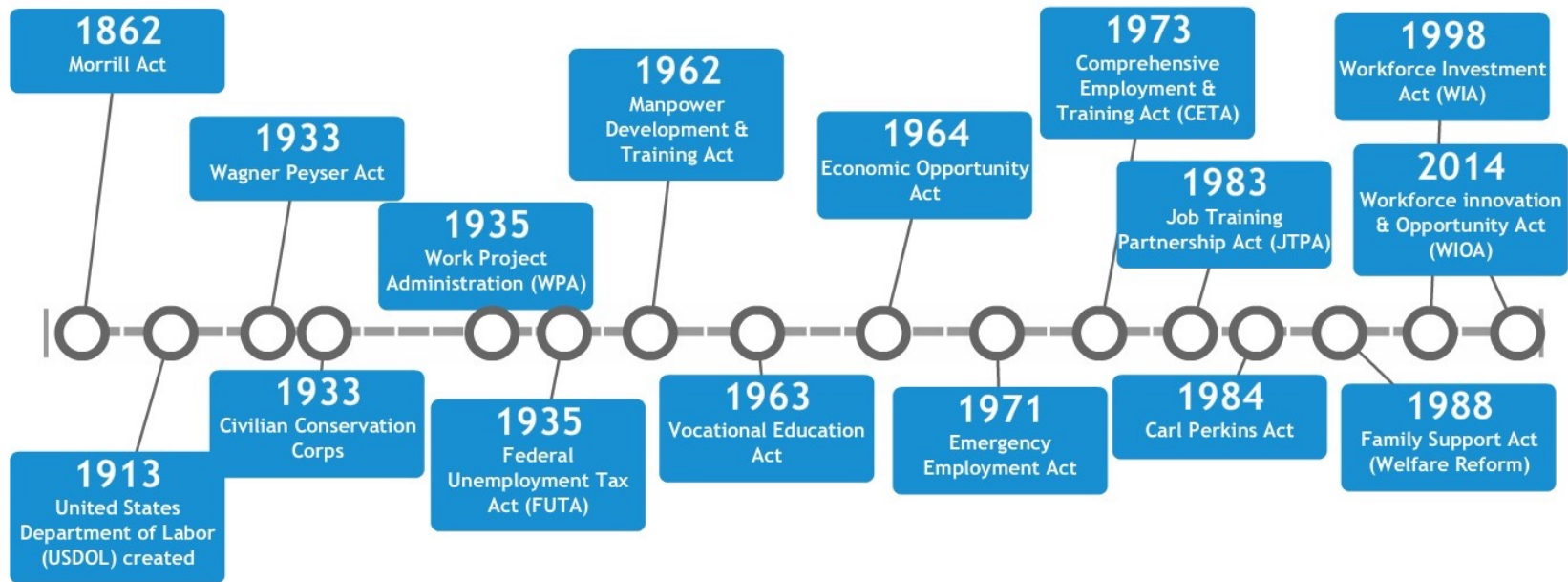

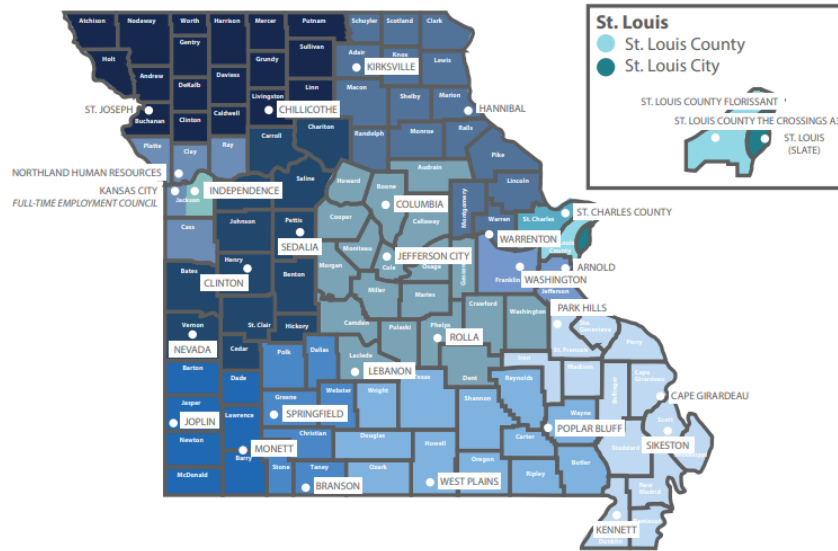

Title III – Wagner-Peyser

- The Wagner-Peyser Act of 1933 established a nationwide system of public employment offices, known as the Employment Service. The Employment Service seeks to improve the functioning of the nation's labor markets by bringing together individuals seeking employment with employers seeking workers.

Title I: ADULT & DISLOCATED WORKER

- Career Services
- Individualized Services
- Follow-up Services

Title I: YOUTH

- Ability to serve youth between the ages of 14-24
- Priority on out of school youth, high school dropout recovery
 - A requirement that 75% of youth program funding at both the State and Local levels be directed towards out of school youth.
- Focus on achievement of recognized postsecondary credentials.
- Career Pathways and work-based learning will be promoted as leading approaches to be adopted on a wider scale.
