

MSA and WDA

- Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)
 - One or more counties centered around a large city
 - Can cross state borders
 - Not every county in the state is included in an MSA
- Workforce Development Area (WDA)
 - Entire State is divided into 10 WDAs
 - Do not cross state borders
 - Every county in the state is included in a WDA







Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS)

- Occupational Employment and Wage data
- Geography: State, WDA (Workforce Development Area), and MSA (Metropolitan Statistical Area)
- Based on Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system.
 - Coding system for occupations
 - Occupational hierarchy with different levels of detail
 - SOC Example:
 - SOC major group: Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (SOC 49-0000)
 - SOC minor group: Electrical and Electronic Equipment Mechanics, Installers, and Repairers (SOC 49-2000)
 - SOC broad occupation: Miscellaneous Electrical and Electronic Equipment Mechanics, Installers, and Repairers (SOC 49-2090)
 - SOC detailed occupation: Avionics Technicians (SOC 49-2091)

- Ten Year Projections (Long-Term)

- Additional Data (on Excel spreadsheets)
 - Wages
 - Career Grade: occupations are graded based on outlook (based on average wages, percent growth, and total job openings)
 - NOW, NEXT, LATER: amount of preparation required for job
 - Education, Experience, OJT typically required for job
 - ACT WorkKeys Assessment Levels
 - STEM designation

- Tool to help compare the future outlook of occupations
- Career Grades can assist students, job seekers, displaced workers, educators and workforce professionals in choosing which careers have the best outlook
- Each occupation is assigned a letter grade from A+ to F
 - Each occupation's grade is unique to its particular geographic region.
- Based on:
 - Projected Growth Percentage
 - Projected Total Openings
 - Average Wages

Occupational Employment and Wage Estimates (0EWS)

The Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) program is a Federal-State cooperative effort that produces employment and wage estimates for about 800 different occupations. In Missouri, the program is operated by the Missouri Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development/Missouri Economic Research and Information Center (MERIC) in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS).

Occupational Projections

Employment projections give an overview of where the Missouri economy may be headed based on past and present trends.

Career Grades Report

Find out which jobs have the best pay, most openings and fastest growth by knowing their grade.

Career Pathways

Career pathways highlight different jobs in sectors, from entry-level to higher skill, that are in demand





Online Job Postings Dashboard





What are Career Pathways?

Each of the career pathways lists occupations at different education and training levels. **Now** occupations typically require short-term on-the-job training. **Next** occupations require training beyond a high school diploma, such as a certificate, associate's degree, apprenticeship, or moderate- to long-term training. **Later** occupations typically require a bachelor's degree or beyond. What are Career Pathways?

Career Pathways are groups of occupations within a career field. Occupations within a pathway share common skills, knowledge, and interests. The pathways use industry-recognized credentials and are examples of how different levels of training or education can help provide opportunities for career advancement.

Why Have a Career in Health Care?

Health Care Science & Services is the largest employing industry in Missouri, making up 14 percent of total private sector employment. The Health Care Science & Services industry has over 12,000 employers that provide jobs to over 318,000 workers across the state.

Missouri's Health Care industry has particularly high employment concentrations in General Medical and Surgical Hospitals, as well as Nursing and Residential Care Facilities. Wages in this industry averaged \$58,788 in 2020, higher than the state average of \$54,801 for all industries. An aging patient population and retiring health care workers contribute to the growing and projected need.

The health care industry provides a variety of work opportunities for every interest. From jobs that directly care for patients to careers that keep the whole system going, important jobs are waiting to be filled in Patient Care, Diagnostic/Therapeutic, and Business Operations.

Know the Basics

Health Care careers often involve interactions with patients and other team members so active listening and communication skills are important. Health Care includes many essential occupations that need to be staffed around the clock so dependability and reliability are a must. Soft skills, such as interpersonal skills, professionalism, and dependability, are important in all industries and occupations.

Skills needed for Success:

Health Care has a set of industry-wide technical competencies that represent the knowledge and skills needed to be successful in this industry. With the need for privacy and confidentiality in these industries, workers need to have knowledge of health industry ethics, laws and regulations, and be able to keep accurate and confidential documentation. Patient interaction, infection control, understanding of drugs and medications, and knowledge of diagnostic procedures, scientific methods and technology are some of the skills needed for success in this industry.


