

Figure 1. Regions




Figure 2. Reason for Child Care




Figure 3. Children Served by Facility




Figure 4. Children Served by Provider



Figure 5. Children Served




Figure 6. Child Care Payments





Figure 7. Children Served By Region

August 2019







12-Month Average September 2018 - August 2019







Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility

August 2019







Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 By Facility





Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility

August 2019







Figure 12. Children Served in Center By Age



12-Month Average September 2018 - August 2019







Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age

12-Month Average September 2018 - August 2019







Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age

August 2019





Figure 15. Transitional Households by Region August 2019





Figure 16. Transitional Children by Region August 2019

Figure 17. Transitional Households Level 1 by Region August 2019





Figure 18. Transitional Children Level 1 by Region August 2019

Figure 19. Transitional Households Level 2 by Region August 2019





Figure 20. Transitional Children Level 2 by Region August 2019

Figure 21. Transitional Households Level 3 by Region August 2019





Figure 22. Transitional Children Level 3 by Region August 2019

Figure 23. Children Served By Provider Type




Figure 24. Child Care Providers By Type





August 2019





Figure 27. Children by Reason for Care
